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SMTC Seeks Public Comment on Long-Range Transportation Plan 2004 Update

SYRACUSE, N.Y. -- The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) has scheduled a meeting to provide an opportunity for public comment on its draft Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) **2004 Update** for June 10, 2004 from 5:30 – 7:30 p.m. The public meeting will be held in the lower level conference room located at the SMTC offices: 100 Clinton Square, 126 N. Salina Street, Syracuse, NY 13202.

The LRTP is a blueprint to guide the Syracuse Metropolitan Area's transportation development over a 25-year period. Updated every three years to reflect changing conditions and new planning principles, the **LRTP 2004 Update** looks at major urban transportation planning issues such as environmental/air quality; access to transportation; alternative transportation modes (i.e., bicycle and pedestrian); the impact of land development on the transportation system; highway traffic congestion; and maintenance of the existing infrastructure. Also included is the **Conformity Analysis**, which successfully determined that the SMTC is in conformity with the applicable New York State Implementation Plan (SIP) for air quality in its adoption of a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Long-Range Transportation Plan, and any pertinent amendments or updates.

The public review/comment period for the draft 2004 Update commenced on May 22, 2004. **Comments received on or before June 21, 2004 will be considered for the final 2004 Update**, to be presented to the SMTC Policy Committee for adoption on June 30, 2004.
