ANNOUNCEMENT OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD AMENDMENT TO THE 2007-2012 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) is seeking public comment on the proposed amendments relative to the 2007-2012 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). This action includes the following:

- Cost adjustments to existing projects
 - PIN 375383 (Kinne Road over Butternut Creek). Total Cost \$449,600.
 - Sponsor Town of DeWitt. Funds will be utilized to complete necessary bridge bearing and joint replacement, miscellaneous concrete and railing repairs and painting.
 - PIN 382257 (Preventive Maintenance). Total Cost \$19,954,134.
 - Sponsor Central New York Regional Transportation Authority (CNYRTA). Cost increases to existing project.
 - PIN 382260 (Replace 6 Call-a-Bus Vehicles). Total Cost \$900,000.
 - Sponsor CNYRTA. Cost increase to existing project.
 - PIN 382270 (Replace 9 Call-a-Bus Vehicles 2011). Total Cost \$1,314,000.
 - Sponsor CNYRTA. Cost increase to existing project.
